

Be best prepared by writing/compiling:

- Personal statement
- Draft answers to commonly asked short-answer questions
- Resume
- Letters of recommendation
- Copy of FAFSA Submission Summary
- Copy of transcripts

- Activities, awards, and achievements
- Community service work
- Leadership experience
- Work experience

- What community service have you done?

- 1. Why do you want to attend college? or Why is education important?
- 2. What will you do with your degree?
- 3. Why do you deserve this scholarship?
- 4. What are your academic goals?
- 5. Tell us about overcoming your greatest challenge.

Things to Remember

- The smaller the pool of candidates, the better your chances of winning.
- Small prizes add up \$1,000 may not seem like much, but win multiple awards and **it adds up quickly**.
- Don't disregard an award based on the giver. If you meet the requirements, apply.



Things to Remember

- Preparing, searching, and applying for scholarships can be difficult!
- Prioritizing scholarships will require a time commitment.
- Some scholarships are super niche and therefore require extra preparation.
- Many undergraduate scholarships are available to graduate students as well - read the fine print!

OSAC Scholarship Guide

Note: George Fox University provides this document as a resource to aid students In searching for scholarships they may be eligible to apply for. It is each student's responsibility to do their own due diligence and verify they meet the qualifications of the scholarships they wish to apply for. This document DOES NOT include every OSAC scholarship. We have geared it toward our students at George Fox University. A complete list of OSAC scholarships can be found at oregonstudentaid.gov/scholarships.

The OSAC Scholarship Application provides Oregon students with access to more than 600 scholarships to help pay for college and career training.

- Application: The OSAC Scholarship Application is a centralized application that allows students to apply for multiple scholarships at once.
- Eligibility: Students don't need to be a merit scholar or have financial need to apply. Eligibility criteria can include high school attended, academic interests, career goals, and school and community activities. Some scholarships require a minimum GPA, while others don't.
- Award amount: OSAC awards more than \$10 million in scholarships annually.
- Early-Bird Deadline: February 18, 2024
- Deadline: March 3, 2025

To Fill out the Application:

- Create an OSAC account
- Complete the "Profile" section
- Select "Continue to Scholarships"
- Complete sections 1–5 of the application
- Upload any additional required documents, such as transcripts, essays, and

Vegetarian Resource Group College Scholarship

Due to the generosity of an anonymous donor, The Vegetarian Resource Group each year will award college scholarship money to graduating U.S. high school students who have promoted vegetarianism in their schools and/or communities.



Tall Clubs International Scholarship

In order to be accepted as a potential scholarship recipient, all applicants must meet the following requirements:

Meet the minimum height requirements for membership in Tall Clubs International— 5'10" (178 cm) for women and 6'2" (188 cm) for men in stocking feet.





<u>United States Navy Memorial Scholarship</u>

The United States Navy Memorial received an endowment from the widow of a Chief Petty Officer with the purpose of awarding scholarships to the grandchildren of deceased Chief Petty Officers (E7, E8, or E9). Each year, application packages will be reviewed and graded by a group of active-duty Master Chief Petty Officers in the Washington, DC area to award a minimum of one but no more than three \$5,000 scholarships.



Duck Callers Memorial Scholarship

Honoring the memories of Stuttgart's legendary champion duck callers and duck calls makers, Chick and Sophie Major, the competition began in 1974 with a single \$500 scholarship given to the winner. The contest is associated with the World's Champion Duck Calling Contest and will take place on the Main Street Stage beside the Stuttgart (Arkansas) Chamber of Commerce.





Stuck at Prom Scholarship Competition

Get ready to create the ultimate prom attire with duct tape! With the Stuck at Prom Scholarship, you'll be literally stuck at prom using Duck brand duct tape to assemble your outfit.









National Marbles Tournament

Fellow mibsters – a.k.a. marble shooters – the National Marbles
Tournament awards 4 college scholarships per year. The requirements? Applicants must be between the age of 7-14 and have won a local marble championship.
Gamers unite in Wildwood, New Jersey for a tournament of over 1,200 marble games for this wacky college scholarship contest.



STARFLEET Scholarship

Star Trek fans can apply for these unique STARFLEET Scholarships worth \$1,000. Applicants must have been members of STARFLEET for at least one year before applying for this unusual scholarship. STARFLEET is made up of hundreds of local chapters with the aim of providing a base for Star Trek fans to interact.



American Fence Scholarship

The American Fence Association awards these little-known college scholarships each year at FENCETECH. Recipients must either be employed in the fence industry or be the immediate family member of an employee in the industry.



See Ya Later Scholarship

The organization provides a handful of scholarships for student in Yamhill County and designates a specific number of scholarships for each high school (for example, 2 for Newberg High, 1 for Yamhill-Carlton High etc.)



Women in Architecture Scholarship

Open to both undergraduate and graduate students who are studying architecture. An award of \$2,500 will be given annually. Sponsored by the Houzz Company.
